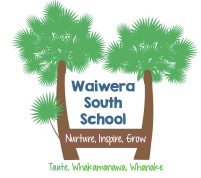

- continuing with and identifying new initiatives to accelerate the learning of the students who need extra support to succeed.

This is a very good report, we look forward to working with Suzanne as our ERO partner during the next three years.

Fundraising for the school continues to be a priority for the board and over the next few months we will be in contact regarding our calf scheme and tailing days. Many thanks for those that get involved, your support is very much appreciated as we continue to deliver a great education for our children.

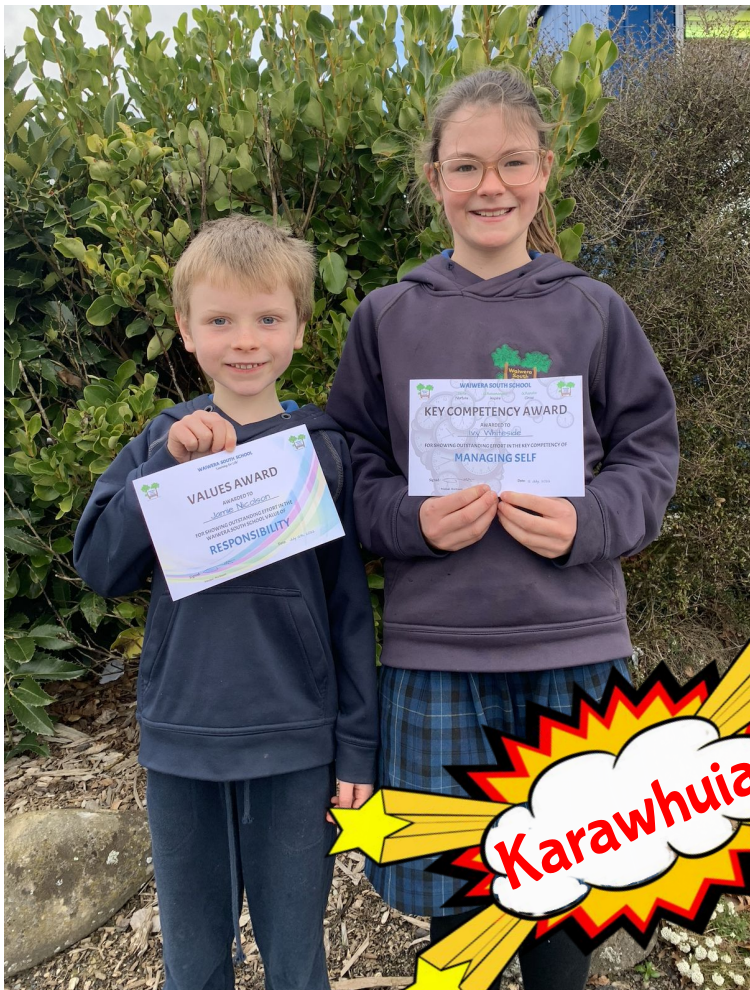

Zealan

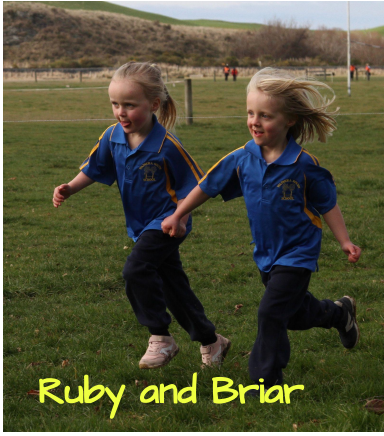
