Kia ora i ngā whānau ō Waiwera South



Attendance

As part of our reporting to the BoT we report against attendance, this will also be reported to you in your child's school report. Waiwera South School has a target attendance of 92 % and above. I found this interesting break down when compiling the individual children's attendance rates.

The Ministry of Education outlines attendance rates as follows

Absence Rates across the year:					
Acceptable	95%	=	10 days (2 weeks of school missed across the school year)		
A concern Critical concern	90% 85%	=	20 days (4 weeks of missed school, one month) 30 days (6 weeks of missed school, over half a term)		
Very serious	80%	=	40 days (8 weeks of missed school, nearly one term)		

Another interesting but scary fact - If your child misses one day a fortnight for various reasons, by the time they reach year 10 they will have missed a whole year of schooling.

Absences do have a significant impact on a child's learning, please be mindful of this.

Red Adaptations at Waiwera South

In regard to COVID-19 we have moved fully into the new traffic light framework for all our school activities and events this year. You will be familiar with all the health measures we will have in place (vigilance around hygiene, handwashing, sanitising and safe coughing) and it is good to know that at the Red Traffic Light Setting, we are able to support everyone learning onsite.

We ask that everyone supports us in following the rules, and understand that things will change as the virus spreads throughout the motu, we will adjust accordingly as directives come in.

How we are working with Red level at Waiwera South School:

- Good hygiene continued to be a major tool, handwashing, sanitising, coughing/sneezing safely and trying to encourage distancing yourself.
- All children in Senior Class, Year 5-8 are to wear masks inside at school
- Masks are optional, but encouraged for Year 1-4
- All children Year 4-8 must wear masks on the bus Year 1-3 are strongly encouraged to
- All necessary visitors to school to wear masks, sign and scan in at office Please do not enter the classrooms.
- Teachers are utilising the outdoor spaces for teaching and learning
- Large gatherings and events will probably not go ahead but each one is being reviewed under the guidelines.
- A focus on ventilation inside and spending more time outside

Events and activities

Large gatherings continue to be one of the riskier activities we can undertake. We are therefore reviewing all our events and activities for the upcoming term to ensure we meet the health guidance for Red. We will continue to assess events, complete risk assessments and make judgement calls as they are required.

Assemblies are still considered high risk at this stage so we will be celebrating successes and acknowledging achievements in house with the children - no parents sorry.
